Foundations Program

The Literacy Foundations program is designed to help you improve your skills in English, Mathematics, and Social Studies in preparation for employment and/or further studies at the grade 10, 11 and 12 levels.

If you need to improve your skills in any of these areas, this program is for you!

Notes for Foundations Classes

1. Students must make an appointment with an advisor to register.
2. New students may be given an assessment before registering.
3. Students will progress through the Foundations program at varying rates according to a number of factors including: previous education, hours of attendance, and how often skills are practiced on a daily basis outside the classroom.

CHANGE IN EDUCATION GUARANTEE FOR GRADUATED ADULTS

The BC Government and the Ministry of Education have announced that effective September 1, 2017 Graduated Adults* will be able to take High School Credit courses tuition-free**.

The following fees remain:

- \$30.00 Student Service Fee (non-refundable)
- \$50.00/\$75.00 Textbook Deposits (refundable)
- \$25.00 Workbook fees (non-refundable)
- \$600.00 International Students

* Proof of BC residency is required. If not born in Canada, proof of status in Canada is also required.

** Some courses still require a course tuition fee for graduated adults. See your academic advisor for details.
