

The School District 42 hockey Academy is integrated inside a normal school day, students obtain 4 credits (PE) and work experience. The Pacific Rim Hockey Academy has a dedicated academic teacher in attendance at all times. This is a private/public partnership bringing together the very best of what both have to offer!

The Districts cross enrollment policy enables students to remain at the secondary school of choice and participate in the hockey academy offered at Pitt Meadows.

The end result? students remain interested and engaged in school, obtain improved academic grades, develop their hockey skills and become strong community citizens.

A Typical Day at the Academy... Students are assigned a hockey block meaning that 3 times a week for the duration of the school year your student will be involved in the hockey academy on or off the ice.

On his/her hockey days the students will arrive at the Pitt Meadows Arena and drop their gear off in assigned dressing rooms.

They may go directly on ice if their hockey block is first thing in the morning. If not they will go to the school and start their day.

When its their hockey block they will come to the rink and participate in the program, shower, store their gear at the rink and return to school. At the end of the school day the students return get their gear and head for home.

The schedule is designed to allow ample time to move throughout the school day and have the students attend all of their classes.

Cross Boundary Students remaining in other secondary schools and participating in the academy will leave their school using their own means of transportation to get to the academy activity at Pitt Meadows Secondary or the Pitt Meadows Arenas once the hockey academy is finished they return to their school. *Car Pooling is common.





Other things to know....

PE is replaced by Hockey Development

Class size is Ministry Standard and comparable to an in-school classroom. Approx 20-30 maximum

Available to goaltenders up to a maximum of 4 per group.

4 staff on ice (2 on ice instructors, 1 goalie instructor and Teacher) (1-6 instructor/Participant Ratio)

There is the possibility of grouping and tiering if more that one group is established it could be skill or grade based. Grouping and assignment is a school decision.

Registration is offered on a first come first served basis.

Uniform/soft goods provided

Timetable management –Calendar provided to teacher, administration, parents and students.




