Carpentry Level I ITA Certificate

Program for Secondary School Students

The carpentry partnership program can lead directly to a career in the construction industry through an apprenticeship leading to journey person certification.

*The program**

This program provides a unique opportunity for secondary students to complete graduation requirements while completing Level 1 of a 4 level program that can lead to a journey person's certification. Additionally, students will acquire skills enabling them to directly enter the job market.

**Adult students and graduating students may be eligible*

This program running out of the Alouette River Campus (corner of 232nd and 132nd) provides students with the theory and practical skills necessary to enter the construction industry.

Students attending the Alouette River Campus can take academic courses on line. Ask your school's Work Experience Coordinator, Career Planning Assistant or Counsellor for more details and options.

The program emphasizes a hands-on approach to training. Experience gained in the workshop is focused on industry practice. The necessary theoretical component is integrated into the program to complement and enhance the practical work. Students are exposed to a variety of work environments through industry tours.

Grading

The minimum grade for individual courses is 64 percent. An overall GPA of 70 percent or better is required. All courses must be passed in order to successfully complete the program.

Dual credits

Students who successfully complete this program will have seven complete courses for 28 credits on the secondary school graduation transcript.

Students can also receive additional credits for Apprenticeship during the summer if they receive approval:

- SSA 11 A (4)
- SSA 11 B (4)
- SSA 12 A (4)
- SSA 12 B (4)

Four credits of Secondary School Apprenticeship (SSA) for every 120 hours worked as a paid apprentice

In addition students receive the following items:

- WHIMIS
- Fall protection
- HILTI certification

Students should have:

- Successful completion of Math 10 Essentials, Applications, or Principles
- Successful completion of English 10
- Driver's license: an asset, but not necessary
- Good physical condition
- High degree of commitment
- Personal safety equipment, steel toe boots and hardhat
