

Application process

- Most recent school transcript of grades (in term transcript acceptable for secondary students applying)*
- Resume
- BCIT application form
- Cover letter indicating motivation and interest in program
- School District No. 42 application form
- Cheque payable to School District 42 in the amount of \$75.00 (non-refundable)
- If you are age 19 or over (or will be age 19 by July 1) you will require a Criminal Record Check which must be attached to your application. Get this done at the Maple Ridge Police Station. (This process may take a few days)

**Students must have completed Grade 11 by the end of the academic year. Grade 11 students must be enrolled in a course of study that will lead to Grade 12 graduation upon completion of high school.*

Please ask the work experience coordinator at your school or your school counselor for any assistance that you may need in completing your application package.

Electrician – Level I

Certificate Program for Secondary School Students

This partnership between School District No. 42 and British Columbia Institute of Technology provides a unique opportunity for secondary students* to complete Grade 12 graduation requirements while earning post secondary credits and certification in the electrical field. Additionally, students will acquire skills enabling them to directly enter the job market.

**Adult students and graduating students may be eligible*

The program

This is a 24-week program running from September to February at Garibaldi Secondary School. The program provides graduates with the theory and practical skills necessary to enter the electrical trade. The electrical worker plans, assembles, installs, tests, repairs and maintains electrical equipment and systems in commercial, industrial and marine facilities.

The program emphasizes a hands-on approach to training. Experience gained in the workshop is focused on industry practice. The necessary theoretical component is integrated into the program to complement and enhance the practical work. Students are exposed to a variety of work environments through industry tours.

Graduates may qualify for advanced standing as indentured candidates within the apprenticeship system.

Program content

The standard program consists of the following course content:

Grading

The minimum grade for individual courses is 70 percent. An overall GPA of 70 percent or better is required. All courses must be passed in order to successfully complete the program.

Dual credit

Students who successfully complete this program will have six complete courses (24 credits) on their secondary school graduation transcript.

Opportunities

An estimated 700,000 jobs will open in trades and technology over the next 10 years, reflecting the vital role skilled professionals play in society.

Program Entry Requirements

- MA 11 (Principles or Applications) *
- ENG 11 (Grade 12 ENG can be taken concurrently)*
- Science 11
- SS 11
- Physics 11 is highly recommended

**May take the BCIT Pre-Entry Math and Reading Assessment in lieu of Math 11 or English 11*

In addition, students must be in good physical condition, demonstrate a high degree of commitment, and provide their own personal safety equipment: steel toe boots, hardhat, safety glasses, etc.

Recommended characteristics

Students entering the Electrician partnership program will have the greatest chance of success if they have the following characteristics:

- Ability to communicate effectively in oral and written English
- Physical and mental abilities required to perform the daily tasks associated with working in construction
- Regular lifting and transportation of heavy objects
- Willing to work outdoors in all weather
- Ability to multi-task
- Motor skills and physical capability necessary for efficient and safe use of trade related tools and equipment
