

# **Presentation: 2017 Energy Challenge**

Alexander Robinson Elementary students Carter and Nick presented to the board about their school's energy generation and energy conservation awareness raising campaign. The initiatives included an electricity generating bike, blanket day, a hands-on opportunity to learn about water-powered turbines, as well as a renewed focus on the school's recycling program. The campaign encouraged all Alexander Robinson students to use and reuse, and earned the school a win in the district-wide Energy Challenge.

## Presentation: Maple Ridge Teachers' Association (MRTA) Social Justice Committee

Teachers on the MRTA Social Justice Committee presented a draft multiculturalism policy to the board, outlining the ways in which this policy might align with existing school district values and structures. Board Chair Murray advised the presenters that the proposed draft policy has been added to the Board Policy Development work plan as part of the Safe and Caring Schools Policy review. The review of existing policies will be done once all policies under review have been updated.

### **School Fees and Specialty Academy Fees Schedules**

The board approved the proposed Secondary School Fees Schedule and Academy Fees Schedule for the 2017/18 school year. #### **Change to June 21 Board Meeting Start Time**

The June 21, 2017 public board meeting time was moved from 6 pm to 1 pm to ensure trustees and staff are able to attend a graduation ceremony.

### **Alouette River Campus Disposal of Real Property**

The board adopted the Alouette River Campus Disposal of Real Property Bylaw. The bylaw and other supporting documentation will be submitted to the Ministry of Education for approval. Once approval is received, the site will be offered for sale or long term lease.

#### **Financial Statements**

The board approved the Third Quarter Financial Statements for the quarter ended March 31, 2017, and approved the transfer of all available operating surplus (currently estimated at \$0.93 million) to contingency reserve – local capital.

### **Board Authorized Approved Courses**

The board approved the following two Board Authorized Approved Courses: Food Studies-Baking 10-12 at Thomas Haney Secondary; Bicycle Maintenance and Repairs 11/12 at Outreach Alternate Secondary.

#### **Westview Secondary School and Inclusion**

Katie MacLeod with Westview Learning Services presented to the board about the work Westview Secondary has been doing in the area of inclusion. Ms. MacLeod noted the school uses a number of different strategies to support students with special needs, including using flex time to connect support teachers with students, and focusing on purposeful course selection. This was the first year of the full inclusion program, which has been a success at the school.

# **2016 Carbon Neutral Action Report**

Manager Alexandra Tudose presented the 2016 Carbon Neutral Action Report to the board. Highlights from the report included projects completed as part of the Board's Energy Management Plan and the Pilot Organics Program. Plans to continue reducing greenhouse gas emissions in 2017 include the replacement and retrofit of existing lighting in 11 school district facilities, and school-based energy conservation workshops aimed at ensuring that students have an active role in reducing energy consumption in the school district. ## **Alternate Programs 2017/18**

Superintendent Russell updated the board about the placement of district alternate programs for September 2017, noting that the new sites will improve accessibility to high school programs, including trades and electives. For September 2017, alternate program locations are as follows: Connex at the Arthur Peake Centre; Re-Connex at Maple Ridge Secondary Annex; Storefront at Thomas Haney Secondary; and Outreach at Maple Ridge Secondary Annex.

## **Energy Management Plan Year 2 Update**

Alexandra Tudose presented to the board about the school district's progress on the Energy Management Plan. Since the start of the program, the school district has completed 26 energy upgrades with an estimated ongoing energy savings of \$0.35 million.
