

Student Emergency Response Procedure

If you see symptoms of a severe allergic reaction or know that a child has been exposed to something they are allergic to:

1. **DO NOT LEAVE THE STUDENT ALONE.**
2. Administer single-dose auto-injector and record the time (_____ a.m./p.m.) the dose is given.
3. **Have someone call 9-1-1** – Tell them that a student has had an anaphylactic reaction.

4. Have someone notify Parent/Guardian/Emergency Contact.
5. The student should rest quietly. **DO NOT SEND THE STUDENT TO THE OFFICE.**
6. Help the student to remain calm and to breathe normally. **An adult must stay with the student.**
7. Observe and monitor the student until the ambulance arrives.
8. **If symptoms do not improve or if symptoms recur**, administer **second dose auto-injector as early as 5 minutes after the first dose is given.**
