THE OPPORTUNITY RELIEF TEACHERS

Reporting to Principals and Vice Principals, the Relief Teacher is a casual on-call exempt position dispatched as needed to provide coverage in classrooms. This position engages with students, provides temporary instructional supervision and guidance, and manages classroom behavior to provide a positive learning environment for all students. This position offers an excellent opportunity to contribute to maintaining a functioning classroom that supports continuity of learning for students along with student well-being and safety. Relief Teachers are dispatched to cover classroom assignments on a day-to-day basis in situations where the school district has exhausted our list of available certified Teachers Teaching on Call. QUALIFICATIONS

1. A post-secondary degree from a recognized post-secondary institution (not necessarily teaching specific) or the following:
 - Currently accepted to or enrolled in a recognized teacher education program,
 - A teaching degree and experience from another country/jurisdiction and not currently certified to teach in British Columbia,
 - An Independent School Teaching Certification in BC,
 - Previously certified to teach in BC with lapsed certification (in good standing),

- Specialized post-secondary training and experience in any of the following areas:
 - French proficiency;
 - Red Seal certification in areas such as chef, woodwork, and metalwork;
 - Early Childhood Education;
 - Instructional Support Staff (e.g., Education Assistant, Child & Youth Care Worker, Indigenous Education Support Worker, etc.);
 - English Language Learner or English as a Second Language (ESL) instructor.
- 2. Demonstrated interest in and 3-5 years successful experience working or volunteering with children and youth.
- 3. Ability to provide a positive learning environment for all students and effective classroom management.
- 4. Exceptional interpersonal and communication skills.
- 5. Satisfactory criminal records check pursuant to the Criminal Records Review Act of BC.
- 6. Must be available to work on short notice as a casual employee on school days (Monday to Friday).
- 7. Must be available for onboarding the morning of September 19, 2024, and for five full days of training during September 23 to 27, 2024.

COMPENSATION

- Effective September 1, 2024, this position will be paid in the following manner:
 - \$327 for a full day dispatch.
 - \$163.50 for a half day dispatch.
- Successful candidates will be compensated for the training days.
