4th Aboriginal Education Enhancement Agreement



- Signed on April 23, 2015 in the Katzie Longhouse following months of preparation by the aboriginal education committee supported by members of the Katzie and Kwantlen first Nations
- First school district to sign a fourth five year agreement



Facilities Plan

- Making the most effective use of available facility resources given shifting demographics and changes in teaching and learning.
- Facilities and Learning for Today and Tomorrow public engagement process completed October 2015.
- Strategic Facilities Plan adopted October 14, 2015.
- Implementation of recommendations underway.
















Facilities Plan

Key recommendations:

- Evaluate and make recommendations to the Board regarding new educational programming
- Secure land for future schools
- New school in South Albion
- Adjust catchments to make best use of available resources











Energy Management Plan



- Adopted by the Board March 25, 2015
- Aims to achieve a school district wide electrical consumption reduction of 30% by 2019 or 4.44 million kWh
- Estimated savings of \$400,000 per year that we can re-invest in our schools



Policy Review and Development

Developed and reviewed/revised several policies during 2014

- Notable among them were:

Board and Staff Advocacy

- Participation in the BCSTA (Fraser Valley Branch, AGM and Provincial Council)
- Election of trustee Clarkson to the BCSTA Provincial Board
- Meetings with Minister of Education, MLAs, Deputy Minister of Education and Assistant Deputy Ministers
- Correspondence with the Ministry on a variety of subjects (overall funding, capital plan)
- Submission to the Select Standing Committee on Government Services and Finance on the 2016/17 budget
- Interviews on radio following the 2015/16 budget process and in several newspapers
- Participation by our Secretary Treasurer on the BCASBO Executive, Ministry of Education Technical Review Committee and Procurement Steering Committee
- Participation by staff on various Ministry of Education committees





Fiscal Challenges

- Due to several cost pressures beyond our control, we estimated that we will be facing an operating budget funding shortfall of \$1.68 million for 2015/16, followed by a budget funding shortfall of \$1.44 million for 2016/17. In order to meet the Ministry of Education mandated administrative savings target and address the anticipated shortfalls we have adopted the following budget balancing decisions:
 - to eliminate school bussing in 2016 instead of having to increase class sizes even further, and
 - to move toward a bring your own device model for students as the current laptops and iPads reach the end of their life expectancy.





Requests of Government

- Acknowledgement of the significant budget reductions the school district has had to make over several years to address inflationary cost increases not covered by provincial funding.
- Acknowledgement that the cuts we've had to make will ultimately have a negative impact on student success.
- A commitment to encourage other ministries to step up (health, social services).
- A commitment to fully fund additional costs over which Boards of Education have no control (wages, benefits, inflationary increases to utilities etc.).





Requests of Government

- A commitment to review and revise the holdback funding model.
- A commitment to review and revise the current funding formula.
- A commitment to review and revise the current system of capital planning to allow better long term planning.
- A commitment to review government's tax policy to provide adequate funding to stop the continuing cycle of budget/service reductions and allow needed improvements.
- A commitment to work more closely with Boards of Education who have responsibility for the delivery of education in establishing the education funding envelope (provincial education budget).





2015 Education Initiatives

- Introduction of an expanded elementary student summer learning program.
- Exploration of greater student involvement in Board Governance.
- Introduction of the new BC curriculum (developed with significant teacher involvement and Ministry staff).
- Continuation of initiatives begun in recent years (Wheelhouse, Environmental School, Elementary Learning iPod project, Inquiry Project, Secondary apprenticeship programs, academies, etc.).
- Continuation and fine tuning of longer standing leading edge practices (Thomas Haney Model, Cyber School).












Student Achievement


- Westview student Emerald UnRuh and Maple Ridge secondary's Joanne Banh both received the prestigious Loran Scholarship.
- Westview secondary sent 3 national champions to the Microsoft World Championships: Nash Taylor (Microsoft Excel 2013), Phillip MacBride (Microsoft Word 2013), and Trevor Dean (Microsoft PowerPoint 2013). Trevor and Dean placed 4th and 5th in the world; Nash Taylor won silver.



Roadmap: Board Operational Plan








- Continue to support and strengthen innovative programs and learning options that enhance teaching and learning
